


Parent Bulletin – Friday 12th April 2024

This Week's Online Safety Article

What is the app age rating?

As a parent, it's important you know that all social media platforms and messaging apps have age limits. Some social networks use technologies that may not be right for some ages or engage with communities made up of people much older than your child. Internet Matters answers these questions in more detail [here](#).



**What are the risks of an underage social networking account?
What can I/my child do if there is something inappropriate?**

They also have guides for the most common social networks your child might be on.

What age do you recommend to begin social networking?

This is going to be different for everyone. However, if the age rating were to do with content, it may be higher. For example, according to the terms of service for Snapchat, users must be 13. Common Sense Media rates Snapchat OK for teens 16 and up, mainly because of the exposure to age-inappropriate content and the marketing ploys, such as quizzes, that collect data.

It's always a good idea to gather as much information as possible before proceeding to download any social media app.

New School Menu and Price Increase

From Monday 8th April we have a new school menu which can be viewed [here](#). Once again, this is a 3-week rotating menu which will run until November 2024. For a more comprehensive menu, including full allergen information on the dishes provided visit schoolmeals.bradford.gov.uk.

We have also been notified by FM Catering that there will be a small increase in the price of a school meal, from £2.25 to £2.35. This will take effect from Monday 8th April.

If your child is in Year 3 or above and you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals, please complete the short form on the [Bradford Council website](#). Children who receive free school meals are also eligible for other benefits including school uniform allowance, free school milk, one free after school club and/or breakfast club sessions.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive Universal Free School Meals, however, you may still apply via the form above. If you are successful, you will receive the benefits outlined above, as well as free school meals when your child enters Year 3.

Homework Expectations UKS2

In Year 5 and Year 6, children will receive homework each week and this will be issued on a Wednesday. In order to prepare them for secondary school effectively, we need to instil in our pupils a sense of responsibility and independence in relation to homework. Therefore, your child's homework should be returned to school by the following Monday each week.

We acknowledge and understand that on occasions your child will forget their homework, therefore children will have a second opportunity to bring their homework on the Tuesday. If homework is not completed each week by the Tuesday, your child will be expected to complete their homework during Wednesday break time.


